Another question that could be asked at this point is: why is this a contract breach matter and not a medical malpractice action? In bringing a contract action, Vacca may have wanted to avoid certain procedural steps required for medical malpractice claims, such as the initial review of the case by a pre-trial tribunal, and the statutory \$100,000 cap on malpractice damages involving a nonprofit provider. In doing so, she was obliged to find a reason other than poor clinical judgment or incompetent care for the harm she alleged, such as the hospital’s desire to exploit her case for the purposes of promoting its psychosurgery program.
